

49 students from ISD in Summer 2022 programs





WANIC Skill Center WASHINGTON NETWORK FOR INNOVATIVE CAREERS

- WANIC Consortium serves Northeast King County
- 7 school districts and 34+ high schools
- Advanced CTE (career technical education)
- 3.0 High School credits per year
- 21 Skill Center programs across 9 locations









WANIC Skill Center programs



- Open to high school juniors (11th grade) and seniors (12th grade)
- Career & Technical Education (CTE)
- Full year (two semesters) Skill Center preparatory programs
- Summer Semester available (grades 9-12) for exploratory programs



What's in it for Students?

- Career pathway experience
- Preparation Employment and College
- Advanced skills training
- State-of-the-art equipment
- CTE graduation pathway fulfilled
- Dual Credit (high school and college credit)
- College credit and/or industry certifications
- Options to continue in 2-year and 4-year colleges
- Student leadership opportunities
- Experienced instructors supported by Advisory Committees



Eligibility Requirements for WANIC applicants

WA

- Registered at a WANIC Consortium high school
- Junior or Senior standing *
- Approval from Career Specialist
- On track to graduate at home high school
- Some programs require an information session
- Some programs have pre-requisites
- April 15th is priority application deadline for programs in Northshore and Bellevue districts
- Must provide your own, reliable transportation



*10th grade students may be considered for some programs





- Show up to every class attendance is critical!
- Complete daily homework/assignments
- Turn in all assignments on time
- Read college-level textbooks
- Practice technical writing
- Demonstrate hands-on skills
- Work independently and in teams

Important Considerations




- Half the school day spent in a different location than home high school
- Commitment and logistics some classes start early (7:00 am) or end late (6:00 pm)
- Transportation, travel time, after school activities, family commitments, work
- Follow calendar and schedules of the receiving school district – often different than home high school and Running Start
- WANIC is NOT a Running Start program

Important Considerations



ATTENDANCE

- Consistent attendance is a key predictor of success
- Can be a big challenge for many students
- Absences have significant impact!
- 1 day of WANIC = 3 days missed in a regular HS class
- Hands-on skills may not be reproduced after absence

Recommendation: Have a Transportation 'Plan A' and 'Plan B'... even 'Plan C' to get to class daily!



WHAT are the COSTS?

- Programs are always FREE!
- Some programs may have supplies/materials fees
- Financial assistance available Barrier Reduction funds
- Any student in any Skill Center program may qualify for assistance if one or more of these apply:
 - Student receives Free/Reduced lunch at sending school
 - Family qualifies for another state-funded program
 - School Counselor confirms family has financial need








Financial Assistance



If eligible for financial assistance, 'Barrier Reduction Funds' can cover costs such as:

- Class fees if applicable (BR funds do not cover optional supplies)
- Required uniform costs
- Gas card or ORCA bus pass (ORCA free if under 18 years)
- Other items may be fully/partially covered





Support Services at WANIC



- WANIC partners with the student's support team from the sending high school to ensure a good fit and the program expectations are clear prior to enrollment.
 - IEP (Individual Education Plan) Special Education
 - 504 Accommodation Plans
 - MLL/ELL=Multilingual Learner/English Language Learner
- Parents/Families: Connect with your school's support team (IEP case managers and counselors) if interested in WANIC programs.



Dual Credit high school and college



Don't forget!



- Students may earn college credit in addition to high school credit
- College credit mainly through Bellevue College or LWTech
- Must apply for college credit and pay fee by end-of-year deadline
- Must earn a B grade or better
- PNWCC provides college transcript


- WANIC/DigiPen students have opportunity to earn credit toward DigiPen Institute of Technology
- DigiPen Student and parent/guardian must declare intent for credit at start-of-year

Automotive Technology

Bothell HS, Bellevue HS


Two year program available

3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) Lab Science (1.0)

*Apply before April 15th

Industry certification: Automotive Service Excellence (ASE)

Discover the real-world experience of automotive careers Use the latest equipment, procedures, and systems.



Aviation Technology - STEM

Location: WANIC @ LWTech

3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) Lab Science (1.0) PENDING

Prerequisite: Geometry

This STEM course is an entry point into a multitude of careers in the aviation industry such as an Airline Pilot, Unmanned Aircraft Systems Operator, or Air Traffic Controller. Students will use a simulator and have the opportunity to earn ground school certificates —

VFR (visual flight rules); IFR (instrument flight rules); and drone skills







Baking & Pastry

Bothell HS
3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) Lab Science (1.0)
*Apply before April 15th



Learn techniques of mixing, shaping, and folding, while applying the science and math behind baking. Practice decorating techniques like sugar and chocolate garnishing in a well-equipped, industry standard kitchen.





Building Industry Technologies Core Plus Construction

Locations: Interlake HS, Bothell HS

3 HS credits: CTE (1.0) Science (1.0) Third Year Math (1.0)

*Apply before April 15th

Basic construction skills, use and safety of shop equipment, precision measuring, material science, print reading, extensive record keeping.





Cisco Networking Academy

Location: Newport HS

Two year program available

3 HS credits: CTE (3.0)

*Apply before April 15th

Industry certifications: Year 1 – CCNA (Cisco Certified Networking Associate)

Year 2 – CCNP (Cisco Certified Networking Professional)

State-of-the-art networking lab. Design, build, manage, and troubleshoot networks.





Culinary Arts

Location: Newport HS

Two year program available

3 HS credits: CTE (3.0)


*Apply before April 15th

Industry certifications: Food Handler Permit

Explore careers in a variety of food related industries. Learn professional food production techniques, restaurant management, catering, purchasing, leadership, and more.









Dental Careers

WANIC @ LWTech

3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) Lab Science (1.0)

Prerequisite: Biology recommended

Explore dental careers opportunities. Learn about instruments, procedures, sterilization, radiography, anatomy, infection control, etc. State-of-the-art dental lab and equipment.

Industry certifications: Basic Life Support First Aid & CPR

*optional: National Entry Level Dental Assistant (NELDA)



Fire & EMS

WANIC @ LWTech

Two year program available

3 HS credits: CTE (1.0) Lab Science (1.0) PE (1.0)

Taught by active, off-duty firefighters.

Industry certification: Basic Life Support First Aid & CPR

Part of each week is spent at local fire departments.

Class is mix of hands-on training and academics.





Health Science Careers (Nursing)

WANIC @ LWTech, Sammamish HS, Woodinville HS

3 HS credits: CTE (1.5) Lab Science (1.0) Health (0.5)

Prerequisite: Biology recommended

Real-life experience at health care clinics.

Industry certification: Basic Life Support First Aid & CPR

Test to become Nursing Assistant Certified (NAC)

and complete the National Nurse Aid Assessment Program (NNAAP).



Medical Careers

WANIC @ LWTech

3 HS credits: CTE (1.5) Lab Science (1.0) Health (0.5)

Prerequisite: Biology recommended

Explore the fields of medicine and medical assisting.

Field trips, job shadows, guest speakers.

Industry certification: Basic Life Support First Aid & CPR





Sports Medicine

Issaquah HS

3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) Science (1.0)

*Apply before April 15th

Pre-requisite: Biology recommended

Learn anatomy, physiology, medical terminology, nutrition, injury prevention, rehabilitation, taping and wrapping, classroom instruction, lab participation, field internships

Industry certification: First Aid & CPR





Institute for Systems Biology (ISB) Systems Medicine

Location: WANIC @ LWTech

3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) Pending Lab Science (1.0)*

Prerequisite: Biology

Interdisciplinary STEM and healthcare professionals are trained in biology, engineering, physics, computer science, environmental sustainability, health, big data, and technology. Students actively engage in a series of hands-on laboratory, computer, and community-based units involving medical systems that aim to be participatory, personalized, predictive, and preventative.







DigiPen Art & Animation

Location: WANIC DigiPen Campus

Two year program available

3 HS credits: Year 1 - CTE(1.0) Fine Art (1.0) Art History (1.0)

Year 2 - CTE(2.0) AP Art Drawing (1.0)

Learn skills to succeed as an artist, illustrator, or animator.



DigiPen Data Analytics & Visualization

Location: WANIC DigiPen Campus

3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) Pending Math (1.0)*

Prerequisite: Algebra 2

Computer science-based program examines practical challenges involving complex realworld data. Extract strategic insights from data, build predictive models to forecast future trends, and efficiently communicate them to inform business strategies.



DigiPen Game Design

Location: WANIC DigiPen Campus

3 HS credits: CTE (2.0) 3rd Year Math (1.0)

For creative-minded students who are deeply curious to understand the behavior and psychology behind games, and eager to learn methods for designing fun and engaging interactive experiences.







DigiPen Music & Sound Design

Location: WANIC DigiPen Campus

Two year program available

3 HS credits: Year 1 – CTE (2.0) Fine Art (1.0)

Year 2 - CTE(3.0)

Combine music composition, history, and theory with practical training in studio recording techniques. Work on a team with video game programmers and animators.





DigiPen Video Game Programming

Location: WANIC DigiPen Campus

Two year program available

3 HS credits: Year 1 - CTE(2.0) AP Comp Sci Principles (1.0)

Year 2 – CTE (2.0) Math Analysis (1.0)

Prerequisite: Algebra 2

Create digital games and interactive experiences.



- Rising 9th through 12th graders
- Exploratory, rigorous, fast-paced, 3 weeks
- No college credit
- Grade reports sent to high school for official transcription - not optional
- FREE! No fees
- Applications open April, after Spring Break



WANIC Summer Semester

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

7 hours per day for three weeks

Only one excused absence allowed

- Students with travel plans or school/sports commitments should not apply
- There <u>is</u> class on Monday July 3rd


