Only officially passed motions of the Board are binding on the Superintendent.

## Accordingly:

- 1. Directions or instructions of individual Board members, officers, or committees are not binding on the Superintendent except in rare instances when the Board has specifically authorized such exercise of authority.
- 2. In the case of Board members or committees requesting information or assistance without Board authorization, those requests can be brought to the Superintendent or designees as defined by the Superintendent. The Superintendent can refuse such requests that are, in the Superintendent's opinion, disruptive or require a significant amount of staff time or funds.
